Wootton's **Illustrated Film Talks** run Monday 25th July to Thursday 28th July:

- Celluloid Sinatra an overview of Sinatra's 60-plus years in showbiz and the 50-plus films in which he appeared, ranging from classic musicals to his Oscar-winning performance in From Here to Eternity,
- Raymond Chandler on Screen an examination of the reclusive life and Hollywood adventures of Raymond Chandler, the legendary American crime novelist and screenwriter who worked with Billy Wilder on 1944's Double Indemnity and with Alfred Hitchcock on Strangers on a Train
- King on Screen: Elvis in the Movies Elvis expert Wootton recounts the history of Elvis Presley's extensive career on the silver screen
- Greene on Screen On the 20th anniversary of Graham Greene's death, Wootton gives an illustrated lecture highlighting the novelist's long and rich relationship with the cinema from his time as a film critic through scriptwriting to adaptations of his books such as *Brighton Rock* and *The End of the Affair*
- Howard Hawkes: An Introduction Wootton uncovers Hawks, the hugely successful independent director of the age, responsible for The Big Sleep, Scarface, Gentlemen Prefer Blondes and Rio Bravo

- MAKING A SCENE: The Magic and Mechanics of Scene Structure focusing on the internal workings of scene and sequence writing as well as the myriad ways scenes can be used to improve the overall structure, emotion and pace of any script, with case studies including Some Like It Hot, Chinatown, The French Connection and Casablanca.
- "WAKE UP, TIME TO DIE!!!" Dialogue and Genre looking at the function of dialogue in a variety of genres and asking the questions "What kind of line does the audience expect at the climax of an action film?" "Is a declaration of love a necessity in a romantic comedy?"
- **TRANSFORMATION:** Constructing a character arc focusing on the creation of a believable and organic character arc which is connected fully both to the character and the structure of the script.
