## AUSTRALIAN DIRECTORS GUILD & MELBOURNE INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL ANNOUNCE NEW PARTNERSHIP

**MELBOURNE, 07 July 2009:** In an exciting new partnership, the **Australian Directors Guild (ADG)** will present its 2009 Conference as part of the **Melbourne International Film Festival (MIFF)** opening industry weekend, which also includes **MIFF 37°South Market** and the **MIFF Accelerator** emerging directors' workshop. It is the first time the **ADG** has held its annual conference in Melbourne since 2006.

The 2009 **ADG Conference**, entitled *Rates, Rights & Revenue*, confronts big questions facing directors in today's evolving creative and business environment. The one-day intensive **ADG Conference** on <u>Monday 27 July 2009</u> focuses on the business-side of directing and provides a critical add-on to **MIFF 37°South Market**, where producers pitch slates of projects to local and international film financiers, and **MIFF Accelerator**.

"We're pleased to be working with **MIFF** on the **ADG** Rates, Rights & Revenue Conference and look forward to bringing producers, lawyers, screen agents and Government agencies together in Melbourne with directors to discuss these issues, and, in the spirit of **MIFF**, to accelerate constructive dialogue between us," said **ADG** President Ray Argall. "As screen content platforms evolve, directors need to understand changing contractual obligations. It is vital to be on top of the industry's creative and economic landscape – particularly in areas such as income rates, creative rights and profit share."

"We are delighted to welcome to Melbourne the 2009 **ADG Conference** - a crucial extension of **MIFF**'s suite of industry activities such as **MIFF 37°South Market**," said **MIFF** Chair Claire Dobbin. "This partnership highlights **MIFF**'s standing and the strength of its industry programs and this new opportunity offers another good reason for every Australian filmmaker to be in Melbourne this July. These events mirror the development of other major international film festivals which have extended their activities to further their city's role as creative and screen finance hubs."

Staged with MIFF for the first time, the ADG Conference follows the 24 July MIFF opening night world premiere of ADG member Robert Connolly's MIFF Premiere Fund co-financed Balibo and the 25 July MIFF world premieres of MIFF Premiere Fund co-financed titles Indonesia Calling and Blessed from fellow ADG members John Hughes and Ana Kokkinos, respectively. As part of the MIFF-ADG partnership, negotiated by ADG General Manager Harriet McKern with MIFF 37°South Market Manager Mark Woods and MIFF Executive Director Richard Moore, Accelerator 2009 directors receive free registration to the ADG Conference, along with 25 producers from MIFF 37°South Market (which runs 23-26 July inclusive), while ADG Conference attendees receive concession rates for tickets to MIFF screenings and the ADG receives 110 free places to special MIFF ticketed event: In Conversation with Michael Nyman, on 27 July after the ADG Conference.
