MIFF PREMIERE FUND SELECTS MIDGET MAYHEM and BLAME

MELBOURNE: 16 September 2009 – Machete Maidens & Midget Mayhem, a new feature documentary from acclaimed director Mark Hartley, and **Blame**, a psychological thriller from debut feature director Michael Henry, are the latest production co-financing offers from the **Melbourne International Film Festival MIFF Premiere Fund**.

Hartley, whose MIFF Premiere Fund co-financed Not Quite Hollywood opened MIFF 2008, returns to the MIFF Premiere Fund as writer/director/ associate producer with producer Veronica Fury on Machete Maidens & Midget Mayhem, a fast-moving odyssey into the little-explored province of Filipino genre filmmaking – complete with miniature James Bonds, karate kicking soul sisters, anorexic Rambos and gun-toting nuns. Peaking during the oppressive Marcos regime, the country became a back-lot for B-movie makers and cinematic visionaries alike, ranging from Roger Corman to Francis Ford Coppola along with a clutch of Australians!

The feature debut of writer/director Michael Henry and producers Ryan Hodgson, Melissa Kelly and Michael Robinson, *Blame* is a psychological thriller concerning a group of young vigilante assailants confronted with the realities of their intervention as their quest for apparent justice takes them to a place from which they can never return. *Blame* was pitched at 2008's MIFF 37°South Market:

PostScript&Direct (speed dating for writers/directors with producers) and 2009's MIFF 37°South Market:

Bridging the Gap (producer pitching to sales agents and distributors).

The two new investments round-out the MIFF 2010 Premiere Fund slate, which includes

- > Kin:, a romantic comedy from feature debut director Amanda Jane and producer Nicole Minchin, starring Steve Bisley, Rhonda Burchmore, Essie Davis, Geoff Paine, Adam Zwar, Nadine Garner, Josh Lawson and Isabel Lucas.
- > Matching Jack (aka Love & Mortar): a romantic family drama from veteran Melbourne director Nadia Tass and producers David Parker and Richard Keddie, starring James Nesbitt, Richard Roxburgh, Kodi Smit McPhee and Jacinda Barrett.
- > Ben Lee: Catch My Disease: a feature documentary by Amiel Courtin-Wilson (2003 MIFF Accelerator alumni) about pop music, spirituality, fame, family and celebrity which profiles the 29 year-old star and includes interviews with Winona Ryder, Claire Danes, Jason Schwartzman and Michelle Williams.

This brings to 16 the number of feature films supported by the MIFF Premiere Fund. MIFF 2009 included the world premieres of the following MIFF Premiere Fund titles: Balibo, Blessed, Bran Nue Dae and The Loved Ones (which are screening at the Toronto International Film Festival) as well as feature documentary Indonesia Calling. The MIFF Premiere Fund, which commenced in September 2007, provides strategic minority financial supports to a range of local theatrical documentaries and narrative feature films that will have their premieres at MIFF.
