## MIFF PREMIERE FUND SELECTS MOTHER OF ROCK

**MELBOURNE:** 16 **December 2009 – Mother of Rock**, a new feature documentary about Australian rock journalist Lillian Roxan, is the latest production to receive a co-financing offer from the **Melbourne International Film Festival MIFF Premiere Fund**.

Directed by Paul Clarke and produced by Robert de Young, *Mother of Rock* profiles pioneering Australian-born rock journalist Lillian Roxon who was one of the most influential rock critics, broadcasters and columnists of the 1960s and early1970s and authored the acclaimed *Rock Encyclopedia* in 1969. The New York-based Roxon, who died in 1973, is remembered in the documentary by the likes of Iggy Pop, Alice Cooper, Helen Reddy and Germaine Greer.

## Mother of Rock rounds out a MIFF 2010 Premiere Fund slate that includes:

- > Kin:, a romantic comedy from feature debut director Amanda Jane and producer Nicole Minchin, starring Steve Bisley, Rhonda Burchmore, Essie Davis, Geoff Paine, Adam Zwar, Nadine Garner, Josh Lawson and Isabel Lucas
- > Matching Jack: a romantic family drama from veteran Melbourne director Nadia Tass and producers

  David Parker and Richard Keddie, starring James Nesbitt, Richard Roxburgh, Kodi Smit McPhee and Jacinda

- > **Blame**: a psychological thriller from director **Michael Henry** and producers **Michael Robinson**, **Ryan Hodgson** and **Melissa Kelly**
- > Ben Lee: Catch My Disease: a feature documentary by Amiel Courtin-Wilson (2003 MIFF Accelerator alumni) about pop music, spirituality, fame, family and celebrity which profiles the 29 year-old star and includes interviews with Winona Ryder, Claire Danes, Jason Schwartzman and Michelle Williams.
- > Machete Maidens Unleashed: from director Mark Hartley (Not Quite Hollywood) and producer Veronica Fury, this feature documentary is a fast-moving odyssey into the Filipino genre filmmaking complete with miniature James Bonds, karate kicking soul sisters, and gun-toting nuns.

This brings to 17 the number of feature films supported by the MIFF Premiere Fund. MIFF 2009 included the world premieres of the following MIFF Premiere Fund titles: Balibo, Blessed, Bran Nue Dae and The Loved Ones (which went on to screen at the Toronto International Film Festival) as well as feature documentary Indonesia Calling. The MIFF Premiere Fund, which commenced in September 2007, provides strategic minority financial supports to a range of local theatrical documentaries and narrative feature films that will have their premieres at MIFF.
