

Beloved Melbourne performer, actor and activist **Uncle Jack Charles** passed away last month after a very full and varied life that also included homelessness, addiction, theft, and incarcareation. Charles, whose family gave persmission for his name and likeness to be used at this time, famously said his life had been saved by participating in <u>BASTARDY</u>, the acclaimed feature documentary about him that world-premiered at **MIFF 2008** as part of the first-ever Premiere Fund slate
