



WHAT IS NEXUS?

MIFF 37°South: Nexus promotes links and business between Intellectual Property (IP) owners holding screen adaptation rights of various formats (including podcasts, musicals, games, stage plays, press articles, short fiction, poems, online content, comics/graphic novels) and screen producers to foster film and TV adaptations of these creative assets.

Nexus is part of screen content financing event **MIFF 37°South Market**, which occurs each August during the opening days of the **Melbourne International Film Festival (MIFF)**.

ADAPTATIONS

Many film and TV projects are adaptations from various Australian IP sources; these are just a few examples: beloved stage musical *Bran Nue Dae* became a high-grossing major movie in 2009; stage play *The Great* was adapted into a TV series for US streaming service Hulu; Henry Lawson's classic short story *The Drover's Wife* was adapted into a stage play and then a 2022 film; *Mortal Kombat* went from video game to big-budget Australian-shot film for Warner and HBO Max; novel *Holding the Man* was adapted into a stage play and then later a movie; *Superwog* was developed from a collection of YouTube clips into a popular ABC TV series; Banjo Patterson's classic poem *The Man from Snowy River* was adapted into a major 1980s movie and award-winning detective novel *The Dry* was adapted into a high-grossing 2021 film.

Internationally, adaptations in recent years have spanned everything from theme park rides (Disney's *Jungle Cruise*), to boardgames (*Dungeons and Dragons*), podcasts (*Homecoming*), press articles (Oscar-winners *Spotlight* and *Argo*) and even viral Twitter threads (A24's *Zola*).

EVENT FORMAT

Nexus comprises a bespoke diary of up to eight scheduled one-to-one meetings between IP rights holders and screen producers who seek new content to adapt for film and/or TV projects, and a networking lunch.

Note: The line-up of producers taking meetings each year differs – so having participated in a previous edition of Nexus does not lessen the value of coming this year, as there will be more producers to pitch to.

HOW TO MAKE SUBMISSIONS

Go to the Nexus application portal found here and fill out the submission form (which includes your company particulars and details of up to five creative assets you will pitch to screen producers for film/TV adaptation).

For producers wishing to receive pitches from IP rights holders at Nexus, but not also planning to register for 37°South's core Bridging The Gap script financing event (which includes Nexus opt-in entry), head to this link for more information and to apply.







FURTHER INFORMATION TO ASSIST WITH SUBMISSIONS

Nexus is about creative assets with film/TV adaptation potential, and for which such adaptation rights are available.

The submission form's major focus is: what makes this property/creative asset suitable for film and/or TV adaptation? In considering this question, some (but by no means all!) of the issues to take into account might include:

- Story + Character: What is it about the characters or plot that make this suitable for filming? Is there a very strong central character for example? Does it concern a well-known person or incident? Is it something with universal themes but particular local relevance? Is the story unexpected? Does the story have a similar feel to another very successful movie or TV show?
- **Setting:** Is the story locale very contained (and therefore cost-efficient for shooting)? Or perhaps it is set somewhere especially famous or visually arresting?
- **Track record**: Does the creator / genre / format have a strong sales record? A definable following? Have any of the creator's other properties been successfully adapted for film/TV? Does this genre/format often translate well into film/TV?

Successful submissions (to be selected by MIFF 37°South Market team) will appear in the *Nexus Screen Rights Catalogue* distributed to all film/TV producers attending 37°South Market. However, please note that only those rights holders who will be represented, and fully participating, at Nexus on **Friday, 09 August 2024** will be eligible to be included in the catalogue.
